**II. BALTIMORE SIGNAL DEPOT ANNEX NO. 3.**—Effective as of 1 March 1949, the Baltimore Signal Depot Annex No. 3, located at the Richmond Quartermaster Depot, U. S. Army, Richmond, Virginia, was discontinued.

2. Department of the Army oversea commanders are delegated Department of the Army authority to approve and authorize superior accommodations for security purposes, for travel within and from their commands.
