I. TRANSPORTATION CORPS MOVEMENT CONTROL OFFICE.—1. *Effective 31 August 1954*, the Transportation Corps Movement Control Office, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Transportation, located at Raritan Arsenal, New Jersey, a class II Installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance, is discontinued.

2. *Effective 1 September 1954*, a Transportation Corps Movement Control Office is established as a class II activity, under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Transportation, with headquarters at the Ordnance Ammunition Command, Joliet, Arsenal, Illinois, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance. The Transportation Corps Movement Control Office at the Ordnance Ammunition Command, Joliet Arsenal, Illinois, will assume the mission and functions formerly assigned to the Transportation Corps Movement Control Office at Raritan Arsenal, New Jersey.
