I. U.S. ARMY BALLISTIC MISSILE AGENCY. *Effective 11 December 1961,* the U.S. Army Ballistic Missile Agency, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance, located at Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, is discontinued.

II. U.S. ARMY ROCKET AND GUIDED MISSILE AGENCY. *Effective 11 December 1961,* the U.S. Army Rocket and Guided Missile Agency, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance, located at Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, is discontinued.

III. FORT STORY, VIRGINIA. *Effective 5 December 1961,* Fort Story, Virginia, a subinstallation of Fort Eustis, Virginia, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Transportation, is designated a permanent subinstallation.

IV. U.S. ARMY TRANSPORTATION AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE SHOP, FORT RILEY, KANSAS. *Effective 1 January 1962,* the U.S. Army Transportation Aircraft Maintenance Shop, Fort Riley, is established as a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Transportation (assigned to the U.S. Army Transportation Materiel Command, St. Louis), with location at Fort Riley, Kansas, a class I installation under the jurisdiction of the Commanding General, Fifth United States Army.

V. U.S. ARMY TRANSPORTATION FREIGHT CONSOLIDATING STATION, GRANITE CITY. *Effective 1 January 1962,* the U.S. Army Transportation Freight Consolidating Station, Granite City, is established as a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Transportation (assigned to the U.S. Army Transportation Terminal Command, Gulf, New Orleans, La.), at the Granite City Engineer Depot, Illinois, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Engineers.

VI..U.S. ARMY CLOTHING AND TEXTILE MATERIEL CENTER, PHILADELPHIA. *Effective 29 December 1961*, the U.S. Army Clothing and Textile Materiel Center, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of The Quartermaster General, is redesignated the U.S. Army Support Command, Philadelphia.

VII..U.S. ARMY GENERAL SUPPLY CENTER, RICHMOND. *Effective 29 December 1961*, the U.S. Army General Supply Center, Richmond, Virginia, a class II activity under the jurisdiction of The Quartermaster General, is redesignated the U.S. Army Support Command, Richmond.

VIII..UNITED STATES ARMY ORDNANCE TRAINING COMMAND, ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, MARYLAND. 1. *Effective 1 January 1962*, paragraph 1, section II, DA General Orders 60, 1958, is changed to read as follows:

Effective 1 July 1958, the United States Army Ordnance Training Command is designated a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance with Headquarters at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance.

2. *Effective 1 January 1962*, paragraph 2, section II, DA General Orders 60, 1958, is rescinded.

IX..UNITED STATES ARMY ORDNANCE SCHOOL, ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, MARYLAND. *Effective 1 January 1962*, the establishment of the United States Army Ordnance School as a Department of the Army service school is confirmed and the school designated a class II activity under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, a class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief of Ordnance.

III..FORT WILLIAM D. DAVIS, CANAL ZONE. *Effective 1 September 1961*, Fort William D. Davis, Canal Zone, was reclassified as an active sub-installation of Fort Gulick, Canal Zone.
