**1. Presentation.**

An award to be known as the Distinguished U.S. Army Service School Award will be presented to service schools in recognition of outstanding contribution to national defense.

**2. Description.**




Figure 1. Sample Plaque Layout

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

This award will be a bronze plaque recognizing more than 50 years of outstanding service. A removable device for recognition of additional years of service in increments of 10 years is available (fig. 1).

**3. Eligibility.**

U.S. Army Service Schools that have been organized and made a noteworthy contribution to the education and training of officers and men of the U.S. Armed Services for a cumulative period of 50 years or more are eligible for this award.

**4. Criteria.**

U.S. Army Service Schools eligible for the award will be restricted to those authorized schools that have made an outstanding contribution to the education and training of officers and men of the United States Armed Forces. In recognition of service greater than 50 years the bronze plaque will be updated in 10-year increments.

**5. Procedure for selection.**

The Service school commandant will submit through command

channels to the Adjutant General, ATTN: AGPB, Department of the Army, Washington, D.C. 20315, a summary of the outstanding accomplishments made by the school in accordance with the criteria outlined in paragraph 4. A suggested date for the presentation will be included with the recommendation. The Adjutant General will forward the recommendation to the Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel for approval. The Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel will, in coordination with the Assistant Chief of Staff for Force Development, adjudge the propriety of each recommendation and secure approval of the Chief of Staff. Each recommendation will be submitted not later than 8 months prior to the proposed date of presentation.

**6. Method of presentation.**

The award will be presented with appropriate ceremonies on the anniversary or other important milestone in the school's history as recommended by the commandant of the respective school. Department of the Army will designate the individual to make the presentation. Budgeting and funding for and procurement of the award will be the responsibility of the Commanding General, United States Continental Army Command. The costs will be charged against Operation and Maintenance Army funds.
